

Fort Bragg Trip
Troop 9 Base Visit and Shotgun Orientation
Feb 27th - March 1st 2009

Description

The trip to Fort Bragg, led by Greg Cordell, will be Friday February 27th through Sunday March 1st. On this two night trip we'll be visiting sites of interest at Fort Bragg and will conduct the shooting portion of shot gun merit badge training at the Fort Bragg target range. NRA certified instructors and safety officers will be on site for this training. We will not "camp" or "cook" in our usual camp site manner. We will be housed in a Scout Hut, and will eat meals at a Dining Facility just as soldiers in the 82nd Airborne Division do.

On Saturday, we'll begin with a visit to "Iron Mike", a famous Fort Bragg statue, then on to the firing range, a museum tour, and bowling in the evening. On Sunday, we will clear quarters, attend a non-denominational church service, and return to Chapel Hill early Sunday afternoon.
