## **Personal Equipment**

Bring car camping gear <http://t9ch.org/Docs/Equipment/Car.html> for cool and rainy weather. Be fully prepared for cool and rainy weather as temperatures are predicted to be in the 40's overnight. Troop tents and gear may be used.

## **Recommended for bike trips**

- a CO2 inflator with two cartridges, or a frame attached air pump (frame pump recommended)
- 3 tire levers
- 1 or two tubes that fit the bike you have
- 1 or two \$1 bills to repair flats
- a multi-tool for bicycle repair
- a patch kit (new ones are glueless)
- a helmet, properly fitted
- #45 sunscreen
- plenty of water (2 quarts minimum per rider)
- a rain poncho (really!)
- Not every Scout/Bike needs an air pump, but each group of bikers should have a pump with them on the trail.
- Each bike should have at least one spare inner tube that fits that bike and a flat tire repair kit.
- A multi-tool is a great idea for each bike.
- An under seat pouch can carry the repair kit, spare tube, and multi-tool.

The Helmet is a must for this Boy Scout Activity. Please make sure it fits properly.

Taking care of your equipment will go a long way in making a Safe & Enjoyable Adventure.

## **Food and Group Equipment**

Food and group equipment will be coordinated at the troop meetings. There will be seven meals total (3

“cooler” lunches, 2 dinners, and 2 breakfasts). If you have questions about your responsibilities, contact your patrol leader.

## **Driving Directions**

1. Depart Subway heading North - 0.2 mi
2. Turn left at Weaver Dairy Rd - 0.6 mi
3. Turn right at N Carolina 86 N/Martin Luther King Jr Blvd - 0.4 mi
4. Turn right to merge onto I-40 E - 22.5 mi
5. Slight right at Raleigh Chapel-Hill Expy (signs for I-440/US-1 N/Wade Ave) - 3.2 mi
6. Take the I-440 N/US-1 N exit toward Wake Forest/Rocky Mt/Wilson - 0.2 mi
7. Merge onto I-440 E/US-1 N Continue to follow I-440 E - 9.5 mi
8. Take exit 14 toward US-64 E/US-264 E/Wilson/Rocky Mt - 0.8 mi
9. Merge onto US-264 E/US-64 E Continue to follow US-64 E - 96.0 mi
10. Take exit 515 to merge onto US-64 E toward Plymouth/Manteo - 79.8 mi
11. Continue onto US-64 Bypass E/Virginia Dare Memorial Bridge - 5.9 mi
12. Continue onto US-64 E - 3.6 mi
13. Continue onto S Virginia Dare Trail - 0.1 mi
14. Turn right at Cape Hatteras National Park Rd/N Carolina 12 S Continue to follow N Carolina 12. S - 58.8 mi
15. Turn right to stay on N Carolina 12 S - 440 ft
16. Take the Cape Hatteras - Ocracoke ferry to Ocracoke - 5.1 mi (NOTE: THIS FERRY RUNS EVERY HOUR ON THE HOUR, EACH DIRECTION, FROM 5AM UNTIL MIDNIGHT)
17. Continue straight onto N Carolina 12 S - 9.4 mi
18. Turn left - 118 ft
19. Turn left - 0.4 mi
20. Arrive at: Beachcomber Campground & Mart 990 Irvin S Garris Hwy Ocracoke, NC 27960

Beachcomber Campground and Ocracoke Station (252) 928-4031 is less than a mile from Silver Lake and the nearest beach access, Beachcomber Campground has 29 sites with electricity and water and 7 tent sites. Hot showers and fully equipped bathrooms are available, as are picnic tables and grills. A deli on the premises offers fresh sandwiches, beach supplies, souvenirs, and T-shirts.
